Awards

Captions will be awarded to bands for outstanding performances in the following area: music, marching, winds, percussion, and Color Guard. A caption will be awarded to any band scoring 85% of the total score in that category. Additionally, the top scoring band in each division will receive a caption regardless of score.

Caption scores are decided by the following criteria:

- Percussion Percussion Judge Score + the percussion score from the music judges
 Color Guard Color Guard Judge Score + the guard score from the marching judges
- Winds Combination of the Woodwind and Brass Scores from both Music Judges
- Outstanding Music Percussion Judge Score + both music judge's score
- Marching Combination of the Marching Judges Score

About State Marching Band

Competition Overview

Beginning in 2025, Wyoming marching bands have the option to compete at the State Marching Band Festival. Bands are divided into classifications based on school enrollment. This year marks the first time a State Championship will be awarded since 1985! Over 1,700 students are participating in the 22 bands represented at tonight's event. These performances reflect countless hours of dedication, rehearsal, and teamwork.

Scholastic vs. Open Divisions

- Scholastic Division Bands in this division perform for a festival rating and judges' commentary, focusing on growth, feedback, and educational experience.
- Open Division Bands in this division compete for scores and placement within their classification.

Classifications (3A & 4A) are determined by the number of participating bands and the enrollment size of each school.

Adjudicators

Music Judge 1 - Philip Haines



Philip Haines, from Las Vegas, Nevada, currently serves as band director at the Pinecrest St. Rose campus in Henderson, Nevada having recently retired as a band director at Foothill High School and Mannion Middle School, the two largest band programs in the state of Nevada. Prior to these positions, Mr. Haines was the Director of Bands at Sierra Vista High School and Las Vegas High School where his bands garnered acclaim for achievements in all areas. His Sierra Vista High School Marching Band is the only band from Nevada to have won a Bands of America Regional Championship and his Las Vegas High School Band was the first from Las Vegas to secure a finalist position in a Bands of America Regional.

Mr. Haines adjudicates for numerous organizations including Drum Corps International, the Western Bands Association, US Bands, the Michigan Competing Bands Association, the Kentucky Music Educators Association, the Northwest Association for Performing Arts, the Intermountain Percussion Association, the percussion and winds portion of the Winterguard Association of Southern California, as well as numerous other state organizations throughout the United States. He has adjudicated multiple championship competitions for Drum Corps International and over a dozen states including Michigan, Kentucky, Colorado, California, Utah, Arizona, and Oregon among others.

Mr. Haines was recently awarded a Lifetime Achievement award by the Nevada Music Educators Association and is a past recipient of the Nevada Music Educator of the Year award. He has been an invited clinician for the Nevada State Music Educators Conference on six occasions. He has also served as an associate professor in the music education program at the University of Nevada Las Vegas and as conductor of the Las Vegas Youth Orchestra's Philharmonic Orchestra (the top of the organization's four ensembles). Mr. Haines lives in Henderson, Nevada with his wife and two children all of whom are also teachers.

Music Judge 2 - Tracy Wright



Tracy D. Wright served as Director of Bands at Ringgold Middle and High Schools in Ringgold, GA for 31 years, retiring in 2024. He led ensembles including the Wind Ensemble, Symphonic Band, Royal Blues Jazz Band, RHS Big Band, and the Marching Tiger Band. Under his direction, the Ringgold Bands performed at the Southeastern United States Band Clinic, GMEA Conference, UGA Mid-Fest, and national celebrations for the White House and The Star-Spangled Banner.

The Marching Tiger Band earned numerous championships and appeared in parades across New York City, Chicago, Atlanta, Washington D.C., The Bahamas, and Canada. The RHS Band has performed at Carnegie Hall (2018), Walt Disney World (2022), and with artists such as Patrick Sheridan and the Boston Brass. They've been honored with a

commendation from the Governor of Georgia, frequent performances at the state capitol, and GMEA's Exemplary Performance Award.

Mr. Wright serves on the operations staff for the American Band College (OR) and Western International Band Clinic (WA), collaborating with world-class conductors and composers. A member of ASBDA and Phi Beta Mu, he was named a Legion of Honor Laureate by the John Philip Sousa Foundation (2018) and has received multiple National Band Association Citations of Excellence.

As a clinician and adjudicator, he has conducted All-State and honors ensembles across the U.S. and abroad, including Australia, Hawaii, and Normandy, France. Mr. Wright holds a Master of Music in Conducting from the American Band College and a B.S. in Music Education from Jacksonville State University, where he was drum major of the Marching Southerners.

A native of Ringgold, GA, he lives in Chickamauga with his wife Amy and daughter Georgia Lou, and serves as an Elder at Covenant Presbyterian Church in Chattanooga, TN.

Visual Judge 1 - Ryan Lee



Ryan is a drill designer, instructor and adjudicator based in Sacramento, California. He has worked with more than thirty competitive programs at the middle school, high school, collegiate and independent levels, in California, Colorado and Hawaii. Lee is a visual judge forBands of America (BOA) and a percussion visual judge for Winter Guard International (WGI). He has been a chief judge, lead visual caption judge and is regularly assigned to championship event panels for circuits across the country. Ryan has been a clinician and consultant for multiple marching bands, color guards, percussion ensembles and is entering his sixth season as a visual instructor with the Mandarins Drum & Bugle Corps.

He was on the instructional staff for the marching band at California State University, Sacramento for four years, and co-taught the Marching Band Methods course's drill writing

sessions, teaching music education majors the fundamentals of visual design, and how to use Pyware. Other affiliations include being a former guest on the Marching Roundtable Podcast, featured in Halftime Magazine, and a member of the Winter Activities Leadership Team for the Northern California Band Association.

Visual Judge 2 - Dr Thomas Kloss



Dr. Thomas Kloss is the Associate Director of Bands and Marching Band Director at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa. In this role, he conducts the Symphonic Band and Fall Concert Band, directs and designs drill for the Rainbow Warrior Marching Band, and teaches courses in music education.

Dr. Kloss received Bachelor of Music degrees in both music education and saxophone performance at the University of Arizona. He received his Master of Music and Ph.D. in music education from Arizona State University, where he taught courses in instrumental pedagogy, research in music education, and was on staff with the ASU Sun Devil Marching Band.

Dr. Kloss has K-12 experience teaching at the beginning and high school band levels, and most recently was the Coordinator for Music Education and the Associate Director of Athletic Bands at Idaho State University, where he won awards for Distinguished Service, Advisor of the Year, and Faculty of the Year.

Percussion Judge - Aaron Hines



For over 25 years Aaron Hines has taught, arranged, and designed for numerous programs, ranging from the middle school to collegiate level while keeping an active adjudication schedule.

Aaron's ensembles have earned circuit and state titles as well as Medals, Fans' Favorite Awards, and Finalist appearances at the WGI World Championships. In addition, Aaron designs independently for programs across the country and serves many clients annually for Visual Choreography, Indoor & Outdoor Drill, Percussion Music, Program Coordination, and Sound Design. He has published works through Dave Glyde Show Designs, GPG Music, Key Poulan Music, Creative Solutions, Jair Klarfeld Music, and JW Pepper.










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
