### **2025 Playoffs Training Email**

# 1. Get The Little Things Right!

- a. As we all know, the little things become big things when we get to the postseason. In the same way a single dropped pass or missed assignment spells doom for a team... us flubbing a measurement or penalty enforcement, or ball watching when we shouldn't, can negatively impact the game. We've got to control what we can control! Own the little things this week!
- b. We've included another, supporting document along with this weekly email. These **Pre-Game Reminders** should be part of your pre-game meeting for your postseason contests. Likely, it's mostly repetitive, but maybe it has something valuable that hasn't been reviewed recently.

#### c. Penalty Enforcement

- i. We need to make sure we're marching off penalties correctly. Be sure to review Table 10-4 as well as the special enforcements in Rule 10-5.
  - 1. Don't be the crew that enforces Holding from the spot in the offensive backfield!
  - 2. Don't be the crew that allows the offense to benefit from the new forward fumble exception!
- ii. Mechanically, we should also find time to practice marching penalties. Are we taking steps (pun intended) to ensure correct enforcement? How can you be a crew saver?
  - 1. <u>Referees</u>. After getting the penalty information and decision from the offended head coach (if required), verify that your Umpire knows the details and begin your penalty announcement/presentation. Use the stadium mic to your advantage!
  - 2. <u>Umpires</u>. Once you verify details with the Referee, get to the basic spot and prepare to march. Check off with the HL and march the yardage together.
  - 3. <u>Head Lines</u>. If your sideline is the effected team, help get a decision from your coach to the Referee. Then align with the Umpire and march together. AFTER the LJ verifies your enforcement is correct, move the chains quickly.
  - 4. <u>Line Judge</u>. If your sideline is the effected team, help get a decision from your coach to the Referee. Then, align with the U at the basic spot. You will HOLD that spot while the U and HL march. Then march the yardage and ensure everyone ends up at the same spot. This is your chance to be a <u>crew saver!</u>
  - 5. <u>Back Judge</u>. Observe, dead ball officiate, relay penalty information across the field, own the clock, communicate clock status to the Referee. Be the last line of defense in case something is flubbed! This is your chance to be the <u>crew saver!</u>
  - 6. <u>Our goal</u> is to have the penalty enforced by the time the Referee's penalty announcement ends! That way the R can simply turn, check clock status with the Back Judge, and blow the ready for play.

### d. Kicking Game

i. This part of the game might be the bane of our very existence, but as we all know, if something is going to go "wonky," it'll be in the kicking game. As you prepare for the postseason, here are a few kicking game situations crews should be prepared for:

- 1. Post-Scrimmage Kick enforcements (2-16-2h)
  - a. What are the five requirements of PSK?
  - b. Back judges -- tell me why you should carry two bean bags.
- 2. Onside Kicks
  - a. For those working 6-man football, this will be like 94% of your FK's!
  - b. Walk through all the possible situations... kick doesn't go 10 yards, blocking too early, pop-up kick, touched in-bounds and then rolls out, etc.
  - c. When do we "cheat up" on free kicks?
- 3. Fair catch situations
  - a. What makes a signal valid/invalid/illegal?
  - b. Know the rules around fair catch/awarded fair catch.
    - i. Mechanics for the "FK for 3" after an awarded fair catch.
- e. Every year, something completely "pear shaped" happens in the post season. A weird penalty enforcement exception, overtime, a timing issue... something.

- f. SO... In addition to the above, be sure to cover these items in your pre-game meeting!
  - i. Measurements
  - ii. Overtime procedures
  - iii. Momentum Rule
  - iv. Long Field Goal mechanics (it's a live ball, and a scrimmage kick!)
  - v. Goal-line and Reverse Goal-line mechanics
  - vi. Force and when a New Force is applied
  - vii. End-of-Half Clock Management (timing issues, under 2 minutes special timing rule, etc.)
  - viii. When a period is extended/is not extended by rule
  - ix. When in Doubts (see attached)
- 2. Post-season Crew Exam:

  - b. Be sure to take this <u>as a crew</u> while you're on the road to your game. I love hearing positive feedback about the discussions these questions lead to while crews are on the road. Heck, you never know when one of these questions might turn into a real-life, on-field situation!
